The regatta will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2001-2004, the prescriptions of the CYA, except as any of these are changed by the sailing instructions, the rules of the Lightning Class, and by the sailing instructions.

Entries

Entries will be accepted from members in good standing of a recognized yacht club or sailing association. Registration at the Race Committee Boat is required. Sailing Instructions available at the Club's office.

Races

There are a total of six (6) races planned. Three races must be sailed in order to constitute a series. There will be one (1) drop race if six races are completed.

Class Flags

Lightning's will use a Light Blue flag w/ Black Lightning Flash as a class flag.

Scoring

The Low Point scoring system of Appendix A will apply.

The net points of the 2002 Canadian Open shall be combined with the net points of the Lightning Pan Am Trials Part 2 to determine the winner of the Pan Am Games Trials as determined by the Canadian Lightning Class. Ties shall be broken in accordance with ISAF standards.

Protests

Protests shall be written on CYA protest forms, available at the club office, and delivered to the RCO within the specified time limit.
